Background – SPORTDiscus and NSIC Operations

1980's

- Dial up access
- Printed *Sport Bibliography & Sport and Recreation Index*
- Searching by librarians and clients time consuming
- Limited current awareness services

Background – SPORTDiscus and NSIC Operations

1990's

- SPORTDiscus CD-ROM – standalone and networked
- Australian records added
- Searching easier by librarians and clients
- NSIC holdings not linked to SPORTDiscus

Background – SPORTDiscus and NSIC Operations

Mid 1990's

- NSIC loads SPORTDiscus records onto DRA Library system
- Integration of NSIC holdings and SPORTDiscus records but time consuming
- Expanded electronic current awareness services

Background – SPORTDiscus and NSIC Operations

2004

- SPORTDiscus available through EBSCOhost
- Journal holdings linked to SPORTDiscus records
- Greater use made of “Alerts’ services

Background – SPORTDiscus and NSIC Operations

2006

- SPORTDiscus Fulltext subscription
- Integration with EBSCO's A to Z Service
- 400 fulltext journals available

Benefits of SPORTDiscus Fulltext

Currency

- Records for core titles generally available within a month of publication - critical for alerting services
- Allows SPORTDiscus to compete with other Databases such as Medline

Benefits of SPORTDiscus Fulltext

Efficiencies in Document Supply

- Currently 600 articles downloaded per month by NSIC staff and clients
- Allow NSIC to manage additional clients
- Document delivery staff assist in digitisation projects



Benefits of SPORTDiscus Fulltext

Cancellation of Print Titles

- Non core titles cancelled - *Quest, Sociology of Sport Journal, Journal of Sport Behaviour, Athletic Business*
- ? EBSCO cannot guarantee long term access to electronic titles in its databases

Benefits of SPORTDiscus Fulltext

Reduction in Indexing

- NSIC ceased indexing over 25 titles – *Modern Athlete and Coach, Inside Sport etc, Golf Australia*
- Under 50 records per month – previously indexed 200 records
- Indexing resources transferred to digital archiving and indexing



Benefits of SPORTDiscus Fulltext

Integration

- SPORTDiscus Fulltext integrated with EBSCO's A to Z Service

Issues with SPORTDiscus Fulltext

Irrelevant Content

- Journals that are not related to sport – *Social Forces, Employee Relations Law Review, American Journal of Drug and Alcohol Abuse*
- Searching more difficult (too many records) and may deter client use of SPORTDiscus Fulltext

Issues with SPORTDiscus Fulltext

Coverage of Major Journals

- Several major titles not indexed –
 - *International Journal of Sport Management and Marketing* ; *International Sports Law Journal* ; *Journal of the Quantitative Analysis of Sport* ; *Journal of Sports Engineering and Technology* ; *Olympic Review* (previously indexed by SIRC) ; *Panstadia* (previously indexed by SIRC) ; *Sports Technology*
- What is the policy for inclusion of journals?

Issues with SPORTDiscus Fulltext

Exhaustive Indexing of ‘Popular’ Journals

- Cover to cover indexing of popular journals – many meaningless records

Issues with SPORTDiscus Fulltext

Narrower Material Content Coverage

- No longer books, conference papers, theses, vide/DVD's
- Need to search other sources – Google Scholar for Conference Papers or Library Catalogues

Issues with SPORTDiscus Fulltext

Thesaurus Terms

- Use of a generic EBSCO thesaurus
 - less specific to sport
- There are specific terms i.e.
Jumper's Knee
- No as critical as many clients use
natural language searching

Issues with SPORTDiscus Fulltext

International Contributions

- NSIC has difficulty in adding records
- Decline in German, French and Spanish records

Conclusion

SPORTDiscus Fulltext has:

- improved client access
- improved efficiencies in NSIC operations
- allowed the NSIC to develop other services – digital archiving of Australian information resources
